Re: October 2024 Head's Letter

It has been an adventurous start to the Autumn term, with pupils getting out of the classroom and engaging with nature. The Year 3 pupils loved the residential camp at Oaklands, competing in challenges and eating toasted marshmallows, and Year 5 have enjoyed the challenges of kayaking and wall climbing at Harlow Outdoor Pursuits. Not to be outdone, Upper Kindergarten children have been exploring our beautiful grounds, finding and sorting shapes. It is wonderful to see the children making the most of these warm autumnal days before winter.

Speaking of winter, it might be a good time to check if the school green winter coat still fits, or the plain black or navy coat for the seniors. They grow so fast over the summer it can be hard to keep up!

Lost Property

Speaking of clothes, we have sorted through the lost property this week, and labelled clothing was reunited with its carefree owners. In order to support our efforts, please ensure that all clothing brought into school is clearly labelled.

Jewellery

The beginning of term is also a good time to politely remind everyone that pupils should not wear jewellery of any sort to school with the exception of a watch and/or a discreet religious symbol. Earrings are not permitted, except from pupils in Year 6, 7 and 8 who may wear a single stud earring in each ear on non-PE days. No earrings are permitted for any sporting activities or clubs. Make up and nail varnish are also not allowed.

Oak-Tree Challenge

I would like to encourage pupils in Years 4 to 6 to take on the Oak-Tree Challenge. This is a popular initiative that encourages our pupils to try new skills, to think about how they can serve their community, and to develop teamwork and leadership skills. The Oak-Tree Scheme is voluntary and pupil-initiated. Some challenges can be completed in school time, while others are designed to be undertaken out of school with parental support. Throughout the nine challenges, there are a mixture of skills and activities being assessed, including voluntary work and independent study. For each stage there is a requirement for self-reflection, which is intended to become more detailed as the children get older. Evidence of the successful completion of challenges will be recorded in a logbook that must be kept up-to-date and completed by the pupils themselves.

Bronze and Silver Award certificates will be presented in the final assemblies at the end of each academic year, and Gold Award certificates will be presented at Speech Day and Prize Giving. All pupils who gain an award will also receive a pin badge to wear on their lapel. The Awards will be entered into the pupils' permanent records and may be referred to in future references. Mrs Bull launched the Oak-Tree Challenge in assembly last week. We hope that all children will choose to participate, enjoy the challenges and feel the satisfaction of achieving goals independently.

Our Open Morning for prospective and current parents is on Thursday 10 October from 9.15am. Please inform the office if you would like to attend and see the school in action. This will also be a great opportunity to tour the Senior School and, if you have not yet had the opportunity, we would particularly encourage our parents to come and see the new classrooms.
