It was heart warming to see their excitement and curiosity as they learned about the changing seasons.








Reception's Outdoor Learning

Music & Science in Year 4

Year 4 have been learning all about sound in their Science unit this half term, exploring different instruments and understanding how sound is made, how we hear sounds, and also how we can change the pitch and amplitude of different instruments. Pupils also researched instruments to understand which family they belonged to: Percussion, wind or stringed. For homework, they applied their knowledge to make their own musical instruments, designing, making and decorating them. They presented their instruments in their Science lesson, showing their understanding. Pupils even used them in their Music lesson to play a whole piece together.













Hello Yellow Day

Coopersale Hall School came together to raise awareness for World Mental Health Day, with both children and staff wearing yellow to mark the occasion. Earlier in the week, during assembly & PSHE pupils learned about the importance of mental health.

Mrs Doherty also reminded pupils about the school's "Listening Ear" programme, which provides a safe space for them to talk to an adult about any worries or concerns. She explained how the program works, pointing out the posters displayed around the school and clarifying how pupils can seek help when needed. The aim is to ensure that every child knows they have support and that someone is there to listen and help make things better.

On Friday, pupils participated in a variety of activities, including a yellow-themed treasure hunt, learning affirmations and creating doodles inspired by The Doodle Boy. While the day was filled with fun, it carried the vital message that everyone experiences different emotions and, for those who may be struggling, the school has multiple support systems, like the Listening Ear, in place. The event also emphasised the valuable resources available through the Young Minds charity, which provides practical guidance for both students and parents.




Year 7 Trip to Mountfitchet Castle

European Language Day

We were delighted to celebrate the European Day of Languages today. Mr. Zaleski opened the assembly by emphasing the many ways people communicate with one another: through speaking, listening, writing, and sign language. He then posed a thought-provoking question: Why choose to speak a different language from the native language of our country?

Speaking another language can help preserve family heritage and allow us to communicate with grandparents or extended family members. It can also provide a deeper understanding of a country's culture and mindset, enabling us to better appreciate its authors, artists, and cultural environment.

As a school, we are fortunate to have the opportunity to learn and communicate in different languages. French is taught to all primary school students, and in secondary school, students can also learn Spanish. During the assembly, Mr. Zaleski invited children throughout the school to share a language they feel connected to.

The whole school gave Amelie, from Reception G, thunderous applause when she sang a song in Portuguese. We were also impressed by the children who confidently counted from 1 to 10 in various languages, including Italian, Greek, Portuguese, Turkish, and Bengali. We were delighted when Zaha, from Year 5 Howard, introduced herself and shared some facts about herself in Urdu. Everyone listened intently to a Sicilian tongue twister, which we enjoyed so much that we asked to hear it twice!





Jessica Donates Her Hair

Jessica in Year 5 hopes to raise £700 for charity having donated more than 13 inches of her hair to the Little Princess Trust. Jessica first donated her hair, which she grew for more than three years, when she was seven years old.

Once again, she has waited three years and now approaching her 10th birthday, she has made a hair donation of the rarest type - more than 12 inches to the charity. She said: "I wanted to do something special to help children that are losing their hair from illnesses like cancer. I am very lucky that my hair will grow back.

"I really hope my hair will bring a smile to them and make them feel really happy. I hope they know I really care about them." Jessica hopes to raise £700 which is how much, on average, it costs to make a wig.

Remembrance

On Sunday 10th November 2024, we all assembled at Epping's Civic Offices for the Remembrance Parade. We all marched together along the High Street to the war memorial. The Vicar spoke to us all and then lots of organisations were called one at a time to lay their wreaths. I was very proud, along with Iman, to lay the wreath on behalf of Coopersale Hall School. All of the children were very respectful and it was a special event to be part of.

The music of Edward Elgar "Nimrod" from Elgar's "Enigma Variations" was playing as the children quietly entered the assembly hall.

The children watched a short video that explained that the annual National Service of Remembrance is held on the 2nd Sunday in November and it is a special time when we remember, reflect and respect those that have made this ultimate sacrifice for the freedom that we now have.

Mrs Graves explained that the Royal British Legion used the symbol of the poppy as it represents hope and remembrance. The children in 4G then joined her to convey to the school many facts regarding the poppy.

The inspiring poem 'In Flanders Fields' by John McCrae was read to the school by our Head Boy, Xander.

We would like to thank everyone who has purchased a poppy during this week leading up to Remembrance Sunday helping the British Legion to support those veterans in need.

The children gathered together once again at 11 o'clock to join the two minutes silence on the terrace with the nation.

Battlefields Trip

Our senior pupils travelled to Ypres in Belgium last week for their annual Battlefields Trip. Accompanied by Normanhurst School, everyone travelled by coach and ferry through France to the Salient area of Belgium to learn about the individual stories of soldiers and their families.

The trips first stop was the Canadian National Vimy Memorial – a memorial site in France dedicated to the memory of the Canadian Expeditionary Force members killed in WW1. It also serves as a place to commemorate Canadian soldiers killed in France with no known grave. Whilst here the children got to experience walking through a set of preserved front line trenches.

The second day of the trip was spent at the Somme, with pupils visiting the High Wood memorial. They then travelled to the Lochnagar Crater which is still in existence today. This highlighted the impact of mine warfare in the Great War.

Pupils witnessed a special commemoration ceremony at the Commonwealth graves in Ypres. Our schools took wreathes of poppies which were laid at certain memorials and graves to pay our respects to the fallen.

Our coach passed through Passchendaele to visit the museum to experience life in the communication trenches in WW1. After the museum stop, they went to Tyne Cot Commonwealth Cemetery to learn about the different allies and nations that fought in the war. Some pupils were able to identify their family surname on the memorial there.

It was an amazing trip – pupils learned about France and Belgium, about the war and about all the individuals who risked their life for their country.

Welcome back to school after a lovely 2 week break. Hopefully the children are feeling refreshed and ready for lots of fun activities this term.


Halloween Discos






Movie Night
